Ray Klinginsmith, a retired attorney from Kirkville, Missouri, USA, served as general counsel and professor of business administration for Truman State University (formerly Northeast Missouri State University) for more than 20 years. From 2001 to 2004, he served as a county commissioner for Adair County.

Ray has served as a director of the Macon-Atlanta State Bank in Macon, Missouri, since 1971, and he was one of the initial trustees for the Missouri Family Trust, which the Missouri legislature created in 1989. He was the president of Chariton Valley Association for Handicapped Citizens since its inception in 1982 until 2009, and is now president emeritus. He received the 1988 Parent/Caretaker Award from the Missouri Planning Council for Developmental Disabilities. He is a former member of the executive board for the Great Rivers Council of the Boy Scouts of America and the holder of its Silver Beaver Award for adult volunteers. He is a member of the First United Methodist Church in Kirkville and a former lay speaker for the church.

A member of the Rotary Club of Kirkville and a Rotarian since 1961, Ray has served Rotary as district governor, chair of the 1998 Council on Legislation in New Delhi, and chair of the 2008 Los Angeles Convention Committee. He was a member of the RI Board of Directors from 1985 to 1987 and chaired its executive committee in 1986-87. Ray joined The Rotary Foundation Trustees in 2002, serving as vice chair in 2005-06, and was a member of the Future Vision Committee from 2005 to 2008. Ray is a Major Donor and a recipient of the Foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service and Distinguished Service Award.

Ray's wife, Judie, is a former elementary school teacher in Macon and Kirkville and a former consultant for the Child Development Assistant program at the Kirkville Area Vocational Center. Ray and Judie have two children, Leigh and Kurt, and three grandchildren, Morgan, Grant, and Sydney Perkins

TODAY'S PROGRAM

Program Chair Mike Telleen introduced Redwood City Rotarian **Mike Giari**, Executive Director of the Port of Redwood City, also known as "**Not Pete's Harbor**". Today **Mike** gave us some interesting facts and information about the Port which was quite enlightening as most Redwood City residents while aware that the Port is there but have little idea of the "industry" contained there and the impact it has. It is economically self sustaining and in fact provides revenue to Redwood City. The Port and industry located there employs some 600 people that generate more that \$6 million in State and local taxes paying some \$4.8 million to the state and about \$800,000 in sales tax revenues to Redwood City. Some 5 to 6 ships per month, mainly Bulk carriers load and unload at the Port the number of which is down considerably due to the economy. When construction was booming in the Bay Area cement was the biggest commodity handled at the Port. Sims Metal handles scrap metal, mainly in the form of crushed automobiles that are destined for China, Korea and Japan, many of which return in the form of new automobiles, steel and other reconstructed items. Among materials coming in are Gypsum from Mexico and Sand Gravel Aggregates from British Columbia being the largest commodity that comes through the Port



The channel into the Port is about 30' deep 2.5 miles long from turning basin out to main channel of bay. The channel is dredged regularly the spoil being used for marsh restoration and Bair Island reclamation There are 5 port commissioners that are elected among them, **Dick Dodge** a former Redwood City Rotarian and recently elected a couple of years ago was **Lorriana Kastrop**, a Peninsula Sunrise Rotarian. With regards to recreation the Port has 190 berths, a public launching ramp and is the site of the 4th July Fireworks, at least it has been till budget cuts doomed the popular event. Another spectacular event is the Parade of Tall Ships. Port security has been enhanced considerably since 9/11 and **Mike** said if he gave us any details on that he would have to kill us. Ferry service to San Francisco has being planned, although as I commented to **Mike** that when I arrived here in 1968 it was being "planned" then. That and high speed rail from San Francisco to Los Angeles.
